

Commemorating the Centenary of the BATTLE OF POZIERES

WESTERN FRONT 23RD JULY 1916

Pozières is primarily remembered as an Australian Battle. The Australian 1st Division initial involvement lasted from 23rd to 27th July 1916 and resulted in 5,285 casualties.

This was first major action in France involving the predominantly Tasmanian 12th Australian Infantry Battalion. During WW1, the 12th Battalion suffered 1,135 killed and 2,422 wounded.
